Finance Committee Report: Gretchen Taylor

- Review of Balance Sheet and Income Statement as of March 31, 2021
- Current Scholar Count is 1544
- ADM @ 135th Day is 1,577.90 -just under our budgeted amount of 1,580
- Weighted Pupils @ 135th Day -2,183.32 -just under our budgeted amount of 2,202.22

Principal and Director Reports:

Kyle Kovach - Elementary School

- Principal Kovach shared school updates:
 - o Our 2021 high school Valedictorian and Salutatorian spoke to the elementary scholars during a PRIDE Meeting -wrapping up month of literacy.
 - They spoke to the elementary scholars about how their hard work has served them and enabled them to have choices and to be accepted to the college of their choice
 - An example of our seniors giving back and being role models to our younger scholars
 - Jump Rope for Heart Campaign -raised over \$8,000
 - Shout out to Coach Scolamiero, the PE team, families and scholars
 - A great way for all to give back during this time!
 - o Currently planning for Summer Academies
 - Accelerated learning plans include an intensive in person program -5 weeks 5 days
 -targeting 50 scholars per grade level
 - Running with 4 teachers per grade level -allowing for opportunities for small groups, esol and special ed support
 - Utilizing a high quality curriculum -giving scholars more supports to reach that high bar and to prepare scholars to be ready for the upcoming academic school year
 - Providing both breakfast and lunch
 - Also planning for increasing socialization as well -that was lost in pandemic
 - Offering 2 field trips to incentivize attendance and just have fun
 - Partnering with Teach for America with a virtual program -to serve 25 scholars in 1st, 2nd and 4th grades
 - to prepare to be ready for upcoming academic school year

Idasa Cobb - Middle School

- Principal Cobb shared school updates:
 - ALPHA Program -created 2 scholarships for the graduating senior class this year -1 male and 1 female -they will be presenting the scholarships tomorrow during the Senior Signing
 - The Middle School will be forming a lion walk leading to the field tomorrow for Senior
 Signing
 - Continuing to plan for Summer Academies -4 separate programs
 - SAFE -Summer Academy for Excellence -5 weeks
 - Serving 220 scholars in person
 - Small groups for multilingual and special ed scholars
 - PE provided
 - Lessons focused on targeted goals and providing weekly progress reports
 - Serving breakfast and lunch in classrooms to maximize instructional time
 - Bridge Week for rising 5th grade -July 19th-22nd-serving 140 scholars
 - SEL Program -small groups to address individual scholar emotional support
 - Summer Institute for Advanced Learners (ALPHA scholars) -TFA partnership
 - o Invitation only -virtual program -60 scholars
 - Middle School teachers will be coaching TFA members to provide them daily support
 - Providing incentives such as chromebooks, t-shirts and gift cards, field trips and parent evenings

LaCheryl Smith - High School

- Principal Smith shared school updates:
 - o Mr Jamison -honored Teacher of Year for staff -also a finalist for our charter school district Teacher of Year
 - Ms Johnson -received WYFF4 Golden Apple Award -featured on television
 - Senior Signing Day tomorrow -channel 4 coming back to publicize
 - New partnership with Southern Wesleyan -we now have 3 partner dual enrollment colleges!
 - scholars will take dual enrollment courses
 - Beginning a Women of Color Program next year with our scholars -the first high school to do that!
 - Clemson will provide the Men of Color Program with Legacy next year as well
 - LaCheryl -Southern Wesleyan's commencement speaker next Friday!
 - Currently Summer Academy Plans -
 - ACT Academy -rising juniors and seniors -June 16th -July 17th
 - Preparing for the July ACT on Legacy campus!
 - Rising 9th graders -taking initial credit courses
 - Dual Enrollment Scholars -taking courses at all 3 partner colleges
 - Credit Recovery Classes -live lessons, edgenuity
 - Universal Therapeutic -partnership with Legacy to provide small groups of our scholars
 -to address anxiety and getting our scholars back in classes for the new school year

Mr. Brown

- Mr. Brown shared about our partnership with Teach for America
 - we are starting our 3rd year
 - TFA Core Members give Legacy a 2 year commitment
 - We are now housing the TFA Summer Training with Legacy instead of them heading to Mississippi
- Introduction to Dr. Marc Zachary -New Executive Director -slowly transitioning to be full time in July
 - o Dr. Zachary shared a little about himself with the Board
- High School Graduation is June 11th at 9am on our soccer field
- Health Clinic -pouring sidewalks today -scheduled to open May 19th -3pm ceremony
 - The Health Clinic will be staffed Mondays through Fridays
 - The Health Clinic will start out serving Legacy scholars and staff first -then move to our families and neighborhood
- 4k Center -busing Board members to visit the new building after the Board meeting today
 - They are currently working on the final punch list and fencing
 - The 4k Center will house 6 classrooms, 1200 square feet each classroom, 20 4k scholars, 2 teachers per classroom
 - Our partnership with First Steps helps provide the funding for our 4k Center as a pilot school
- Mr. Brown met with Chris Neeley -the Superintendent of the Charter School District
 - He wants to plan with us to get more Legacy schools up and running
 - He will help work with us through funding possibilities
